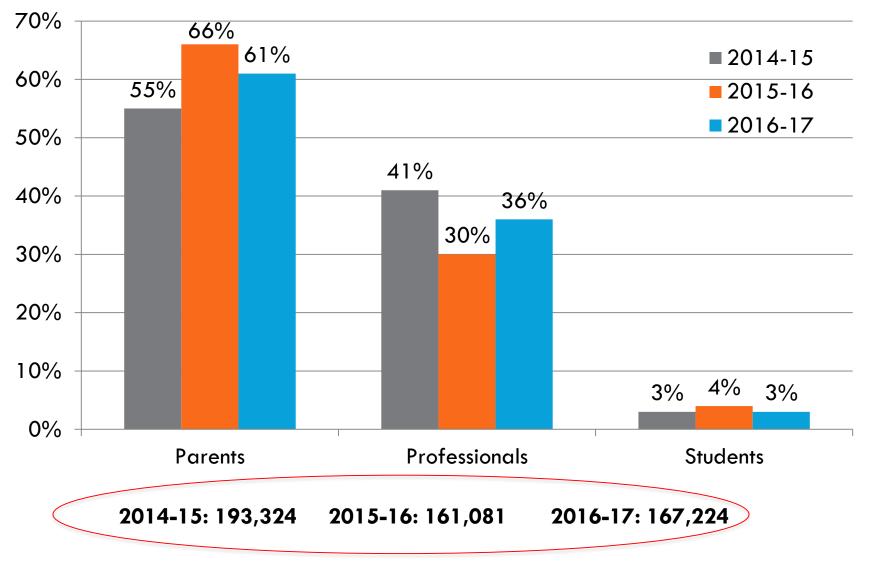

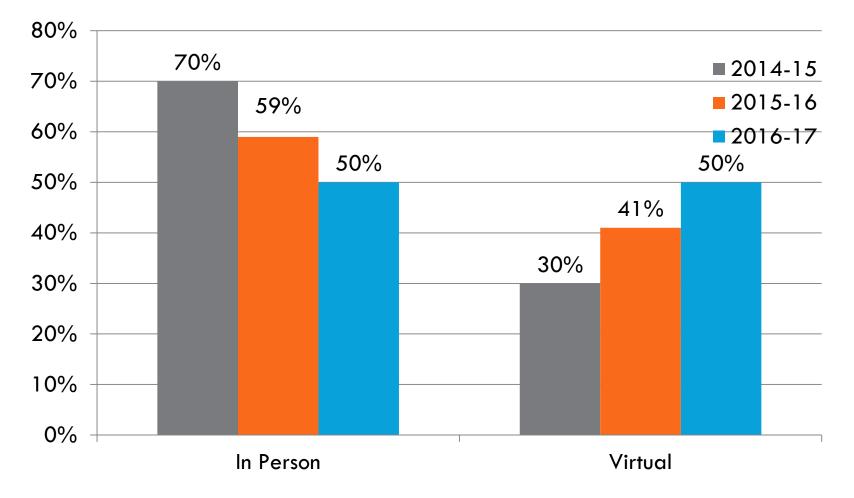

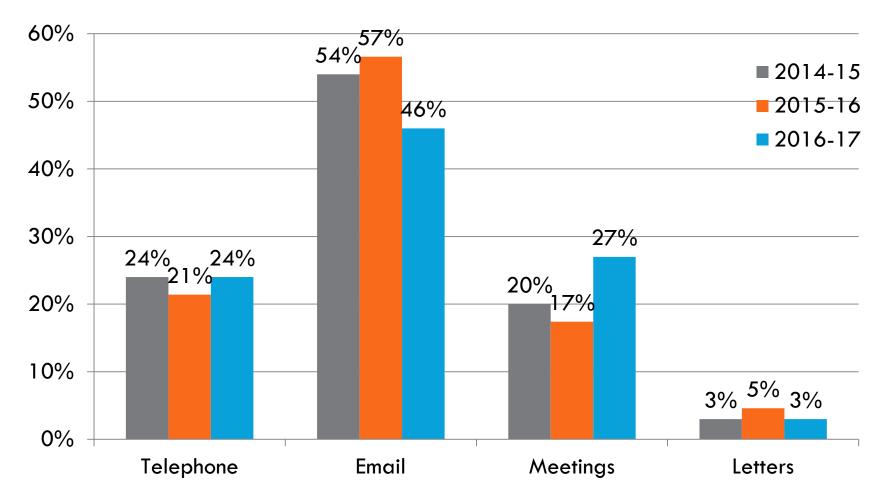

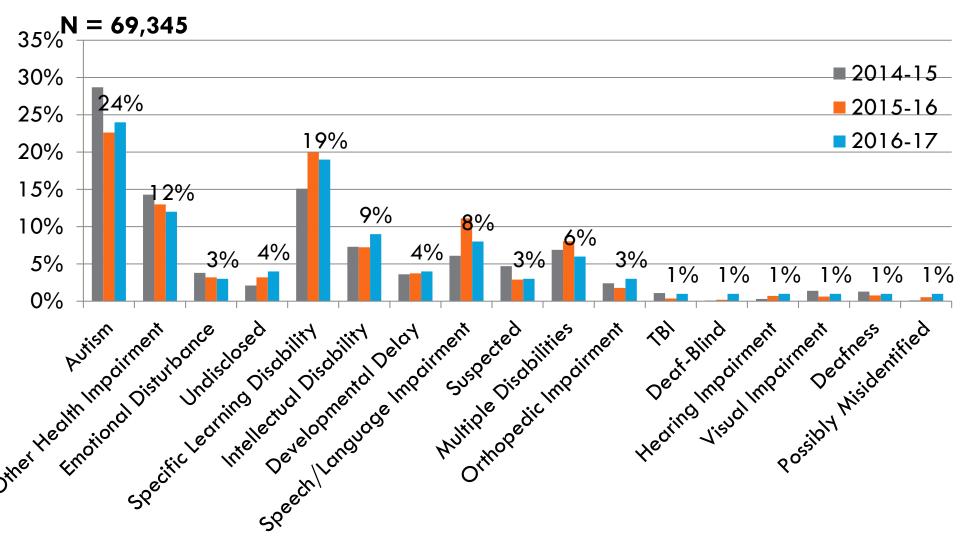

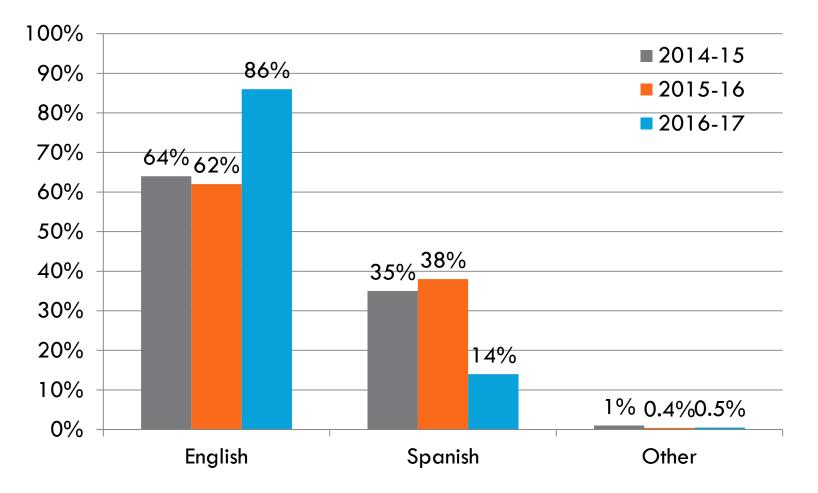

#### **REGION 3: PROVISION OF INDIVIDUALIZED TA – PERCENT BY CATEGORY**

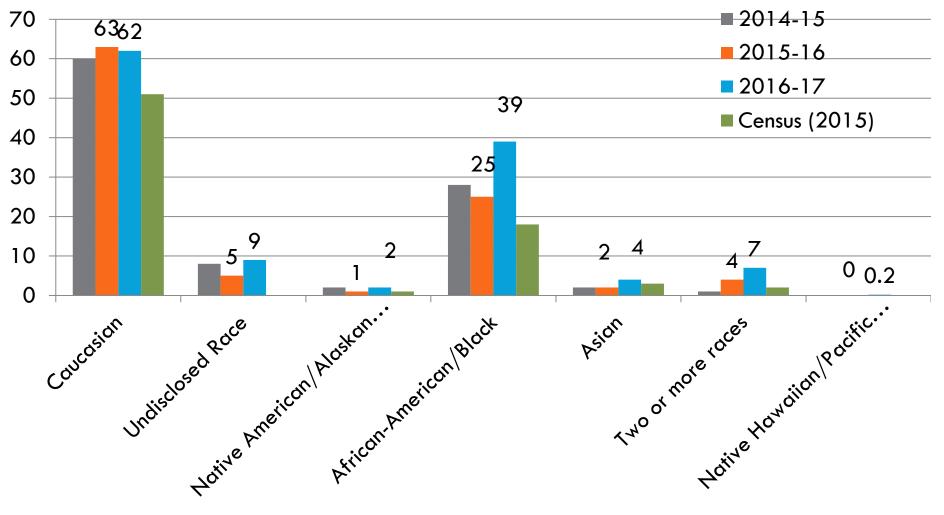


# REGION 3: LANGUAGE IN WHICH PARENTS WERE SERVED % OF CONTACTS

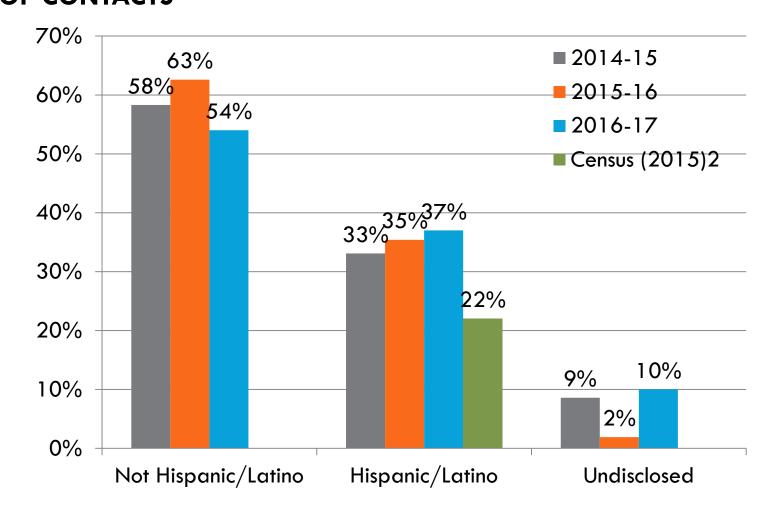


## **REGION 3: YOUTH & FAMILIES SERVED BY RACE**

# **GRANT MANAGEMENT CONCEPTS**

ESTABLISH STRONG PARTNERSHIPS

- Clarify roles and responsibilities
- Support a results-oriented approach
- Demonstrate excellence, accountability, and success on performance outcomes



# **GRANT MANAGEMENT CONCEPTS**

MONITOR BOTH PERFORMANCE AND FISCAL COMPLIANCE

## PERFORMANCE

- Implement project as approved
- Clarify goals, objectives and activities
- Demonstrate substantial progress annually
- Keep records



## FISCAL

- Demonstrate accountability and financial stewardship
- Ensure costs are allowable, reasonable and allocable
- Access funds on reimbursement basis
- Adhere to federal regulations

# **UNIFORM GUIDANCE**

Streamlines and consolidates government requirements for receiving and using federal awards so as to reduce administrative burden and improve outcomes

Education Department General Administrative Regulations (EDGAR) and Other Applicable Grant Regulations

Title 34, Code of Federal Regulations (CFR), Parts 75-79, 81 to 86 and 97-99 EDGAR is currently in transition.

# Risk Management

<ul> <li>Excessive Drawdown</li> </ul>	The Department has established expected rates for quarterly use of federal funds and monitors draw downs monthly. Excessive drawdowns occur when grantee exceeds those expected rates.
<ul> <li>Large Available Balance</li> </ul>	Continuation awards can be impacted by having a large available balances (LAB) . 70% of project budget is available 90 days or less before the budget period ends; especially in Years 3+
<ul> <li>Annual Audit</li> </ul>	Institutions receiving \$750,000 or more in federal funding annually must include those funds in an annual audit and report the results. <u>All</u> Parent Centers should do a single audit or project specific is fine.

# FOCUS ON CONTINUOUS IMPROVEMENT

SELF ASSESSMENT FOR PROGRAM IMPROVEMENT

- ✓ Are we carrying out activities required by IDEA?
- ✓ In what ways are we able to provide evidence that the services provided improve outcomes for families and children?
- ✓ Is our project serving all families?
- ✓ How effective are we at reaching all families?
- ✓ Are we building our organization's capacity?
- ✓ How well does our Board & project staff work together?

# FOCUS ON CONTINUOUS IMPROVEMENT

A BRIEF NOTE ABOUT THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

- Directors need to be knowledgeable about the structure of the organization, the funded project, and the project activities
- Directors should be updated often with complete, transparent information about the organization's activities and finances
- Directors need to be knowledgeable about their roles and responsibilities

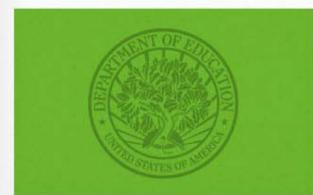
